Monologue. The woman sited in the Bible as having an “issue of blood” for 12 years tells the story of her life and her healing by touching the edge of the robe of Jesus.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Faith, Living Bible Stories, Jesus

CHARACTERS: 1 Female

20 Minute Miracle

Monologue. A homeless man relays an experience of a young man who showed him respect and friendship which causes him to remember the stories of Jesus that his mother read him in his childhood.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Caring for Others, Jesus

CHARACTERS: 1 Male

A . . . What?

Sue and Bill have always wanted his sister, Renee, to find the “right person.” Now, however, Sue has been told by Renee that the “right person” is another female. How will Bill react when Sue tells him his sister is a lesbian?

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Homosexuality, Unexpected Challenges

CHARACTERS: 2 Female, 1 Male

All Things To All People

What good is someone who claims to be able to give you anything you want, but has absolutely nothing to give? This comical sketch takes a look at someone trying to be “all things to all people.”

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Lack of Commitment, Empty Promises

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female

Barn Party Skit

This audience-participation skit is a fun tale about truth and justice told with an Old West slant. This was written for a Church Barn Party.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Truth, Justice, Character, Self-Sacrifice

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male (utilizes 3 Audience Members)

The Best Surprise

Kid's Script from Bible Super Hero Series tells the story of Easter with Bible heroes John, Joseph of Arimathea, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of Jesus, Salome – and most of all, Jesus.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Easter, Friendship, Faith, Love

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female (only one speaking part)

Birthday For a King

Kid's Script from Bible Super Hero Series tell the story about the birth of Jesus.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Christmas, Jesus' Birth

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female (only one speaking part)

Blue Collar

A wife is shocked and distressed when she sees how her husband and children set a person's value by their economic standing in this comical sketch.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Prejudice, Parenting, Character, Materialism

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male, 1 Female youth, 2 Male Youth

The Body

A reader's theater rendition of 1 Corinthians 12:12-26

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Spiritual Gifts, Unity, The Church, Relationships with Others

CHARACTERS: 7 Male or Female

Born to Be Like Us

Reader's theater skit touching on the purpose Christ left Heaven to come to Earth.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Christmas, Jesus, Our Value to God

CHARACTERS: 4 Male or Female

A Bug's Life

Y2K, the "millennium bug", is on his psychiatrist's couch. He considers himself a failure because he didn't accomplish the disasters everyone, including himself and his family, anticipated. The doctor shows him what it means to bounce back after failure and unmet expectations.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Surviving Mistakes and Failure, Forgiving Yourself, Unmet Expectations

CHARACTERS: 1 Male, 1 Male or Female

The Call for Ministry

This unique one-word-at-a-time skit deals with the idea that everyone has been given different gifts and passions for different ministries in the church.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Ministry, Spiritual Gifts, The Church

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male

The Cave

Joe and Tom are experienced cavers. Though Joe is a real jokester, he has no patience for a novice caver who attempts the activity totally unprepared. Tom helps him remember when they were novices and how important it is to help those who are new to the sport.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: New Christian, Patience, Mentoring

CHARACTERS: 3 Male

Chip Off The Old Block

Stan and Linda are getting ready to leave for a party where Stan is hoping to be named the new partner in his firm. We learn that Stan used some pretty unethical means to take this position from a friend at the firm. Linda forgets her purse as they leave for the party, and Carl, their teenage son, takes this opportunity to “borrow” money from his mother’s purse. When Linda walks in on Carl taking the money, Carl justifies his actions by claiming he is only behaving in the way he has been taught by his parent’s methods of getting what they want.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Parenting, Situation Ethics, Honesty, Character

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male, 1 Male Teen

Choir For the Musically Challenged

The woman in this monologue discovers that having a wonderful voice isn’t the only way to make heavenly music.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Talents, Spiritual Gifts, Evangelism

CHARACTERS: 1 Female

Cold Hands, Warm Heart

In this extended holiday sketch, a daughter brings home a street person on Christmas Eve. Though, at first, the parents are distressed and upset, in the end, the true meaning of Christmas is discovered.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Christmas, Serving Others

CHARACTERS: 2 Female, 1 Male, 1 Female Teen

(Extended Script Cost: \$25.00)

The Conversation

Two people can have completely different views on a subject – even two committed Christians. Is it more important to prove your point – or to simply have the conversation?

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Respecting Others, Handling Disagreements, Diversity, Tolerance

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female

(Also available on video for \$25.00)

Creation, Incarnation & Re-Creation

Three monologues or readings centering on the love of God shown in the creation of the world, Christ being born as a human, and our home in Heaven. This script was used in a Thanksgiving production filmed for television. Works very well with appropriate musical numbers before and after each element.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Creation, Jesus, Christmas, Heaven, God’s Love, Easter

CHARACTERS: 1 to 3 Male or Female

A Drive for Patience

Norm is a father in a big hurry to get home to watch “the game.” Stacey is his teenage daughter who he takes out for some extra driving practice.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Patience, Parent/Child Relationships

CHARACTERS: 1 Female Teen, 1 Male

The Express Lane

Should you believe everything you read, see, or hear? Two people in an express lane have very different opinions on what is a “reliable source.”

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Gullibility, Faith, Who/What Do You Trust, Media

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male

Faith of Our Founding Fathers

This script is an assisted compilation of quotes from John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, and George Washington that highlight their thoughts on faith and religious freedom.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Religious Liberty, Faith, America

CHARACTERS: 4 Male

Family Worship

Mark’s plans for Family Worship don’t exactly turn out the way he anticipated, but a valuable lesson is learned nevertheless.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Family Worship, Forgiveness, Becoming Like Children

CHARACTERS :1 Male, 2 Female, 3 Children (2 Female, 1 Male)

The Final Flight Home

Sara is at an airport waiting to meet her birth father for the first time. Will her father be disappointed in what he finds? A stranger helps her realize the unconditional love and acceptance of a father. Two possible endings are given.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: The Second Coming, Parent/Child Relationships, God’s Acceptance

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male, 1 Offstage Voice

Final Peace

A very brief reader’s theater showing that genuine peace is found in the words of a dying Savior.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Peace, Crucifixion

CHARACTERS: 3 Male or Female

(Due to length, this script is \$6.00)

Finders Keepers

Kid’s Script about stealing, illustrating the 8th Commandment.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Stealing, Friendship, Commandment 8

CHARACTERS: 3 Older Children (2 Female, 1 Male)

Finishing The Race

Kid’s Script. It’s the day of the big race, and Jerry’s coach doesn’t seem to know what he’s doing. Should Jerry follow his advice or listen to a coach who has experience running the race himself?

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Choices, Jesus, Taking Advice

CHARACTERS: 5 Older Children (2 Female, 3 Male)

The Follow-Up

Bill happens to answer the door to Pastor Barnes, who is delivering a free Bible to Bill's mother from the prophecy meetings she has been attending. This boldly comical sketch shows how evangelism should **not** be done.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Legalism, Evangelism, New Believers

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 2 Male

Fruits of the Spirit (6 script set)

Kid's Script. This is a series of six 2-3 actor skits written for a Children's Church Program. They were performed for the children, and then the children were asked which of the Fruits of the Spirit they were depicting.

Self-Control (can be easily adapted as a puppet sketch)

Patience

Faithfulness (a skit in limerick style)

CHARACTERS: 2-3 Male or Female for each skit

Giving Leftovers

What kind of gifts do we bring to God? Do we keep the best for ourselves and offer Him our leftovers?

Bill and Nadine have a unique theory about the gifts they give to Bill's parents.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Stewardship, Gifts, Selfishness

CHARACTERS: 1 Male, 1 Female, 1 Male or Female (the Neighbor could be either M or F)

God Can Use Me

Kid's Script from Bible Super Hero Series tells the story of Moses.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Moses, Spiritual Gifts, Trust

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female (only one speaking part)

God is Greater

The story of Elisha and the King of Aram is told in Street Theater style, where audience members are used as characters to tell the story.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Faith, Encouragement, God's Power, Trust

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male, (utilizes 6 audience members, 3 Male, 3 Male or Female)

Great In The Sight of the Lord

John the Baptist was given a crucial mission. However, he found his greatness in becoming less so that Christ could become more.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Humility, John the Baptist

CHARACTERS: 5 Male or Female (can be done in Reader's Theater style)

Healthy Choices

Kid's Puppet Script. This Puppet Sketch was written for a mission trip children's program and deals with making simple lifestyle and food choices to be healthy.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Health, Choices

CHARACTERS: 2 Puppets male or female

Hope

Reader's theater sketch touching on the hope found in the love, promise and power of our Creator and Savior.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Hope, Creation, Christmas, Jesus

CHARACTERS: 5 Male or Female

I Am An American

This reader's theater drama shows the many faces, personalities, beliefs, and lives of America.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: America, Diversity

CHARACTERS: 5 Male or Female

I Just Wish I Didn't Feel So Alone

This script is comprised of three separate short monologues of women in very different life circumstances but all caught in a situation of domestic abuse – physical, psychological, and emotional.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Domestic Abuse

CHARACTERS: 3 Female

Instructions Included

Marcy has a rare evening alone, so she decides to surprise her husband by completing a project she has put aside for too long. She begins with great enthusiasm but is soon brought to total frustration by indecipherable manufacturer's instructions and a less-than-helpful 24-hour hotline.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Unexpected Complications, Understanding the Bible

CHARACTERS: 1 Female

Isaiah 58 (A)

A reader's theater rendition of scripture in a story format.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Character of God, Service, Relationship with Others, Spending Time With God

CHARACTERS: 5 Male or Female

Isaiah 58 (B)

A reader's theater rendition of scripture.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Character of God, Service, Relationship with Others, Spending Time With God

CHARACTERS: 5 Male or Female

Joseph Good and Bad

Kid's Script from Bible Super Hero Series tells the story of Joseph (Jacob's son) with the story fluctuating back and forth from "That's Good" times and "That's Bad" times.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Joseph, Trust, Faith

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female (only one speaking part)

Joy Comes In The Morning

This is a three-part drama centered around the resurrection. In the first part, Mary, Mother of Jesus, reminisces about her son's early years and agonizes over his death. In the second part, Mary of Magdala returns to the tomb to reconfirm that her Savior has risen. In part three, two of Jesus' followers exuberantly come upon Mary at the tomb and joyously (and somewhat comically) relate to her their experience of meeting a man on the road to Emmaus only to discover it was the risen Lord.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Easter

CHARACTERS: 2 female, 2 male

(Extended Script Cost: \$25.00)

Just As I Am

What does it mean to be at the Lord's Table? Eight actors, each portraying someone from a variety of backgrounds tells what this table means to them. Perfect sketch to use before a Communion service.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Acceptance, Body of Christ, Lord's Supper

CHARACTERS: 3 Female, 3 Male, 2 Children Male or Female

King Milkum

A street-drama style skit where two actors use chosen audience members as characters in the story of a young princess who dreams of freedom away from her father. A dastardly villain helps her to see what freedom life with the king actually offers.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Freedom in God, Attraction of the World, Unconditional Love

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male (Utilizes 3 Audience Members, 2 Male, 1 Female)

The Last Supper

This full-length drama explores what each of the disciples might have thought when Jesus told them there was a betrayer among them. Written with contemporary language, this script uses DaVinci's Last Supper painting for staging and stresses the forgiveness Jesus offers for all of our failures.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Good Friday, Forgiveness, Failure, Jesus

CHARACTERS: 13 Male, 1 Male or Female

(Extended Script Cost: \$50.00)

The Liar's Market

Kid's Script. Jimmy wants to avoid consequences for something he did wrong, but he soon finds out that telling lies to cover mistakes only make things worse. Illustrates the 9th Commandment.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Lying, Honesty, Commandment 9

CHARACTERS: 4 Older Children/Earliteens (2 Male, 2 Female)

The Lord Provides

This sketch was written to highlight a program at our church where, for one week per quarter, our facilities are used to house homeless families who are in a program to rebuild their lives. However, the drama is relevant with regard to any service ministry. What kind of attitude should we have when people do not react with the kind of gratefulness that we think they should?

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Ministry, Grace, Service, Relationship with Others

CHARACTERS: 3 Males, 1 Female, 1 Teen (if necessary, any number of male characters can be changed to female)

Luke

This monologue portrays Bible author and physician Luke speaking about the healing ministry of Jesus. Incorporates two additional dramas – 20 Years of Misery and The Road Less Traveled – as examples of compassion and healing. Can be used with or without these scripts, simply incorporating the Biblical stories of the woman with the issue of blood and the Good Samaritan.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Jesus, Compassion, Healing,

CHARACTERS: 1 Male

Mamas Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up To Be Pastors

Lyrical parody using the tune of “Mamas Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up to Be Cowboys.”

Mary

This is a three-part monologue portraying Mary, mother of Jesus, in three stages of her life: ready to give birth just after arriving in the stable, before Jesus leaves home to do His “Father’s work,” and after the crucifixion. This extended drama works well with appropriate musical numbers performed before and after each scene.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Good Friday, Jesus

CHARACTERS: 1 Female

(Extended Script Cost: \$25.00)

A New Beginning

Five of Jesus’ followers and an angel present their despair at Jesus’ death, wonder at His life, hope at his ascension, and anticipation of His return in this Reader’s Theater drama.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Easter, The Second Coming, Hope, The Ascension, Jesus

CHARACTERS: 2 Female, 3 Male, 1 Female or Male

A New Colossus and the Great Invitation

Framed by the history of Emma Lazarus and her poem, The New Colossus, which is engraved on the Statue of Liberty, this patriotic reading compares the poem to the Great Commission given by Jesus.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: America, Service, Tolerance, Mission, The Church

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 3 Male or Female

Noah

Kid’s Script from Bible Super Hero Series tells the story of Noah.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Noah, Obedience, Faithfulness, God’s Love

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female (only one speaking part)

Not So Thankful

Old-timers Ed and Bill play a constant game of “I’ve Got It Worse Than You” in this comical sketch.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Thanksgiving

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 3 Male

Offering to Help

What would your ushers do if a visiting homeless person began taking money from the offering plate as it is passed? This is an unapologetically humorous skit of misunderstood but generous intentions.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Giving

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 2 Male, 1 Narrator, 3 Extras

Olympic Endurance

This skit was born from the struggles of our congregation after the 2004 hurricane season. Michelle and Carl have been without power, gas for their car, or water for over five days. Light and humorous.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Patience, Endurance

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male

The Parable of the Sower

A readers theater presentation of the Parable of the Sower in limerick.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: God's Word, Evangelism

CHARACTERS: 3 Male or Female

A Part of the Promise

This full-length Christmas presentation incorporates four original songs. The town of Bethlehem is filled to capacity leading to challenges, joys, and an unexpected change of heart, all culminating with the arrival of Joseph and Mary. Filled with humor and tenderness, your audience will laugh, cry, and gain a new understanding of the life-changing power in the arrival of the promised Messiah. Anticipated length including one intermission: 1 hour.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Christmas

CHARACTERS: 7 Male, 7 Female, 1 Male Youth, Various Extras

(This play is being performed as a dessert theater production at the Florida Hospital Church in December of 2009. Script will be available beginning January of 2010.)

(Full Production Cost: \$100.00)

Partners in Crime

Tony is offered an all-expense paid trip to Colorado for he and his family by Ann. The only problem is that Ann is a supplier wanting to get a contract with Tony's employer. Tony knows that accepting this offer would be ethically wrong and begins to refuse the offer only to be told that his closest friend and mentor at work accepts this type of gift from Ann regularly. Tony is bound by his employment contract not only to refuse such an offer, but to report anyone whom he is aware has accepted such an offer. This open-ended sketch is a great opening for a sermon.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Situation Ethics, Making Difficult Choices, Moral Dilemmas

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 2 Male

Peace in a Storm

The story of Jesus calming the waters is told in Street Theater style, where audience members are used as characters to tell the story.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Jesus, Faith, Trust, God's Peace

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male, (utilizes 6 audience members)

Playing Second Fiddle

What happens when an instrument decides it doesn't want to be what it was created to be?

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Talents, Spiritual Gifts, Humility, Teamwork

CHARACTERS: 2 Violinists (Male or Female); 2 Voices (Male or Female)

Politically Correct

This comical sketch delves into how involved a Christian should be in the political process. It is election time, and Joey and Dave are of two completely different opinions.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Christian's Role in Politics, Appreciating Differences

CHARACTERS: 2 Male

The Prophet

How would people react to a modern-day prophet? What if that prophet was Cosmo Kramer of Seinfeld fame? Join Jerry and the gang in this comical sketch.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Prophets

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 3 Male

Putting Others First

Kid's Script from Bible Super Hero Series tells the story of Esther.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Esther, Obedience, God's Protection, Faith, God's Faithfulness

CHARACTERS: 2 Male or Female (only one speaking part)

Questions

Being a parent isn't always easy. The older children get, the harder their questions are to answer. However, the perfect answers aren't as important as allowing the questions in the first place.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Parenting, Questioning God, Being Real

The Rich Fool

A Reader's Theater version of Luke 12:13-21 in story format.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Greed, Sacrifice

CHARACTERS: 2 Female or Male

The Right Fit

Bob is looking for a new suit, but he would rather wear the suits of other men whom he admires, thinking wearing their clothes will help him become like them.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Christianity, Spiritual Gifts

CHARACTERS: 2 Male

Righteousness Pyramid

Based on the \$100,000 Pyramid, contestants try to win by guessing categories based on religious behavior clues. This unapologetically funny sketch exposes Christians who know all about proper outward behavior and nothing about grace.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Legalism, Grace

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 2 Male

Risking It All

Michelle and Brad are getting ready to move into the home of their dreams. Michelle is chatting with her friend, Kara, when Brad comes home in a panic. He has given the money for their down payment to an acquaintance that he has unwisely given money to and lost before on his “get-rich-quick” schemes. Kara is devastated, not just by the loss of the money, but by the loss of trust.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Unwise Choices, Trust, Marriage, Communication, Stewardship

CHARACTERS: 2 Female, 2 Male

The Road Less Traveled

This is a monologue given by the Jewish man who had been assisted by the Good Samaritan. What was his perspective on the event, and how did it change his life?

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Ministry, Service, Relationship With Others

CHARACTERS: 1 Male

The Rookie

Larry has invited a new friend from work over to watch a World Series game. His new friend is new to America and doesn't know much about baseball. Larry's intensely sports-minded brother doesn't understand how someone can be so ignorant of the sport he loves so dearly. This drama was used in a service about how Christians view and relate to those who are new in their faith.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: New Christians, Patience, Tolerance, Inclusion

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 3 Male

Santa Isn't Coming To Town

This extended skit introduces the Jolly family, who truly believe that Santa brings gifts at Christmas. So why, since they try to do everything right each year, doesn't he come? This is a blatantly comic sketch portraying a family who truly misses the real meaning of Christmas.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Faith vs. Works, Legalism, Christmas

CHARACTERS: 2 Female, 2 Male, 1 Female Teen, 1 Male Youth

She'll Never Know

Kid's Script. This puppet sketch is about obedience and understanding that your parents have reasons for rules. Illustrates the 5th Commandment.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Obedience, Honoring Parents, Commandment 5

CHARACTERS: 1 Male or Female, 1 Male or Female Puppet

Simeon & Anna

This is a three-part sketch from the perspective of Simeon & Anna before and after Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to the temple for his dedication. The Savior was not what anyone would have anticipated.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Jesus, Unexpected Savior, Crucifixion

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male

Single Perspective

What are the unique challenges that the single individuals in the church face? This question is explored by four singles in four different life situations.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Singleness, Church Family, Caring For Others, Facing Challenges

CHARACTERS: 4 Mixture of Male and Female

The Sixth Day

Gabriel and Lucifer discuss God's plan for his new creation called "Man."

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Creation, God's Character, Freedom

CHARACTERS: 2 Male, 1 Narrator

The Soup of Forgiveness

Tim Taylor (of Home Improvement fame) has a hard time accepting Jill's forgiveness for something he did.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Forgiving Ourselves, Relationships With Others, Marriage

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 2 Male, 2 Male Teen/Youth

The Story of Ruth

A street-drama style skit where two actors use chosen audience members as characters in the story of a young woman who chooses to live in a land of strangers because of her love for God and her mother-in-law.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Faith, Trust, Love, Christian Life

CHARACTERS: 1 Female, 1 Male (Utilizes 4 Audience Members: 1 Male, 3 Female)

Supersized

How do you relate to someone who is dealing with an issue that is awkward to discuss? Do you avoid the issue at all costs? In this broadly comical sketch, Spiderman, Superwoman and Batman do everything they can to avoid dealing with a very obvious issue that Superman is struggling with.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Things We Don't Like To Talk About; Relationships With Others; The Church; Confronting Uncomfortable Issues

CHARACTERS: 2 Female, 3 Male

Survivor - Narcissist Island

What happens when tribe members don't understand the meaning of teamwork?

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Teamwork, Selfishness

CHARACTERS: 2 Female, 2 Male

Taking the Blame

How can someone who is entirely at fault turn things around to make the offended party feel guilty? This is a comical sketch taking place at a dry cleaners.

SUGGESTED TOPICS: Manipulating People, Using Guilt, Boundaries
